EXTRACTS FROM A LETTER CONCERNING ENGLAND, WHICH MAY BE OF SOME AID TO ALL OF US IN THE EVENT THAT WE ARE ORDERED TO ENGLAND.

Expenses are much less in most any foreign theater than they are in the states unless you are located in some large place like London. The normal pay will more than keep you going unless you are located in a large town where hotel accommodations, meals and recreation are fairly high. Recreation will probably be the most expensive item. The average cost of liquor is \$6.00 per bottle. Rations will be deducted on your pay voucher.

There are two methods of sending money home; first, the finance department has arrangements for sending money home thru the Finance Service. Secondly, one may send money home thru Postal Money Order.

Wearing of cotton clothes is not authorized in England, even if it were the weather is not warm enough to be really comfortable without a blouse or a woolen shirt most of the time. If baggage allows, it is advisable to carry two blouses since it takes approximately ten days for cleaning. Either the short overcoat or trenchcoat are most commonly worn. Buildings, trains etc. will be unheated and even tho you may not like it, long underwear is a lot of help. If you don't like the issue kind, buy an adequate quantity of the kind you do like. A good set of long underwear in England costs approximately \$16.00. The QM and PX carry a stock of clothing covering practically all the items required.

If you use an electric razor, be sure to get a resistance cord or or resistance unit, to reduce the current from between 200 to 250 to our normal 110. Amperage apparently is OK. This will apply to any American built electrical gadgets. The current in England runs from 200 to 250 volts. The British use electric sockets of the type normally used by us in automobiles, also, their plug-in gadgets, in place of being two-pronged and flat, are two-pronged and round, so adapters will be necessary for plugging into either electric light sockets or wall plugs.

In general the things that are the most difficult to obtain are the minor items, such as; refills for pencils, pencil erasers, refills for notebooks and small personal items that we have become used to and don't think of them until we are out of them.
